THE MEANING OF TZOM GEDALIAH

In this momentous season it is perhaps easy to gloss over the fast day of *Tzom Gedaliah*. After all it follows immediately *Rosh Hashana* and it pales in the glow of *Yom Kippur*. But such a superficial view would be a mistake

The assassination of the Jewish governor appointed by Nebuchadnezzer led to the condition that the *Rambam* describes rather poignantly- "The ember of Israel that remained was extinguished, causing their exile to become complete."

No doubt this was another step in our exile necessitating a fast day. Our sages in the Talmud seem to be saying something a little different. "The fast teaches that the death of the righteous is equal to the burning of the house of *Hashem*".

Rabbi Pilichowski in his work *The Moadim* explains how this can be so? The purpose of fasting is not to miss several meals but rather repentance. When we merit by our behavior we receive divine protection which may manifest itself in the presence of the Temple. When we fail we may lose that desirable condition.

The righteous have the ability of illuminating for us the divine path. Hence with their death we lose our connection, our guide. In that sense the loss of the righteous is like the loss of the Temple.

Recently we lost a great codifier, Rabbi Elyashiv o.b.m. Such losses need to be appreciated and understood as a monumental loss. We can only hope that we deepen our connection with the divine and then we will merit the rebuilding of the Temple and the return of our judges as of old...
